

### \$15,000 Small Business Grants Are Available

The Louisiana Main Street Recovery Program offers grants of up to \$15,000 to Louisiana businesses affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Within the first 21 days of the programs, grants will be prioritized for businesses who did not receive a Payment Protection Program loan (PPP), insurance payment, or an Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL). To be eligible, businesses must have had 50 or fewer full-time employees as of March 1, 2020.
